As per Eureka City Ordinance No. 980, An Ordinance regulating the licensing and control of dogs and other animals within Eureka City Section 12-242 License and Registration Required.

It is unlawful for any person to keep, harbor or maintain any dog six or more months old
unless such dog has been registered and licensed with Eureka City <u>(includes small house dogs)</u>. Anyone owning, keeping, harboring, or maintaining <u>three or more dogs</u> over the age
of six months shall be considered operating a dog kennel and shall be required to pay an
annual kennel license fee of \$25.00 per year upon approval by City Council.

Limbs and yard waste must be taken to the City Dump. No milled wood allowed in limb pile.

Tires must be placed in dumpster marked for "Tires Only"

Oil is only accepted during normal Dump Hours, not during cleanup.


