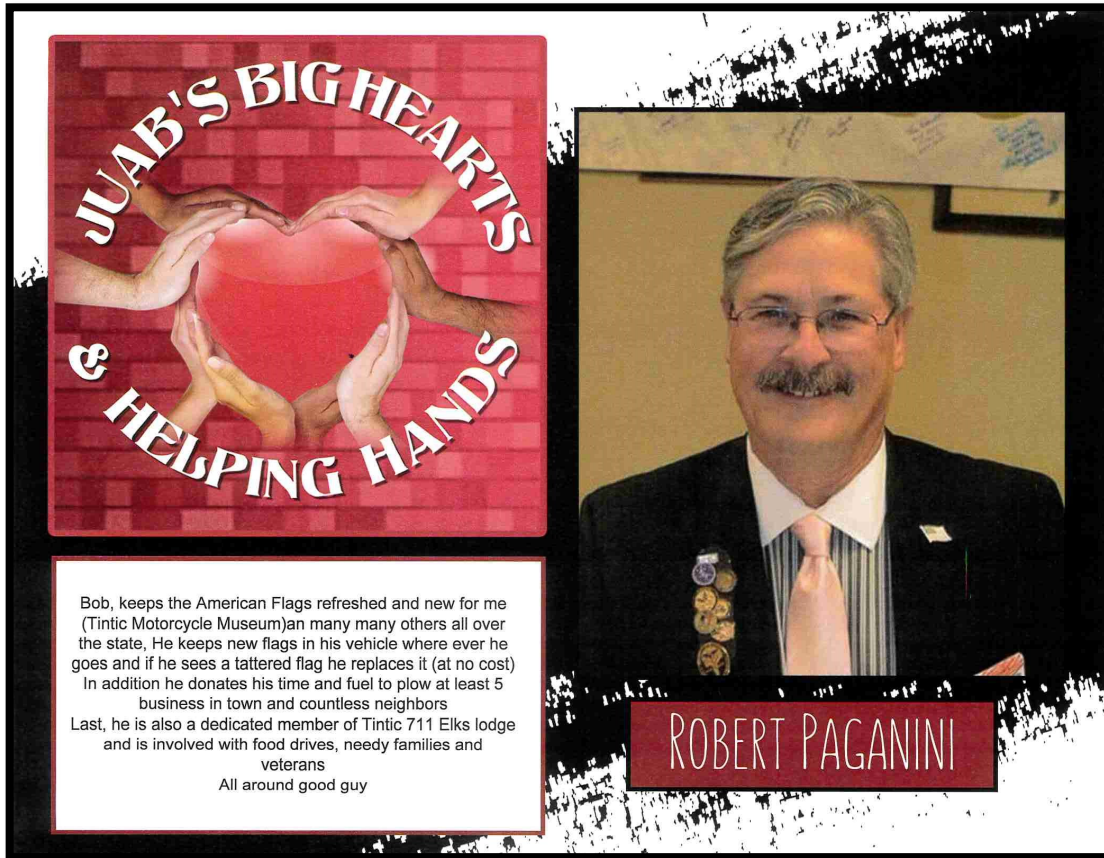

As per Eureka City Ordinance No. 980, An Ordinance regulating the licensing and control of dogs and other animals within Eureka City Section 12-242 License and Registration Required.

- It is unlawful for any person to keep, harbor or maintain any dog six or more months old unless such dog has been registered and licensed with Eureka City **(includes small house dogs)**. Anyone owning, keeping, harboring, or maintaining **three or more dogs** over the age of six months shall be considered operating a dog kennel and shall be required to pay an annual kennel license fee of \$25.00 per year upon approval by City Council.

UCA 20A-9-209

Declaration of Candidacy Forms or Nominating Petitions must be filed with the Eureka City Recorder during regular business hours located at 15 North Church Street, Eureka, Utah, Monday – Friday 8:30 am to 5:00 pm. Candidate Filing Fee is \$35.00.

Candidates may file remotely or through a designated agent if the individual is located outside of the state during the entire filing period. UCA 20A-9-203

The qualifications for a candidate are:

- (1) Be a United States Citizen;
- (2) Be a registered voter of Eureka City;
- (3) Be a resident of Eureka City for 12 consecutive months immediately preceding the date of election.

City Recorder to adhere to the requirements of UCA 10-3-301 (2).

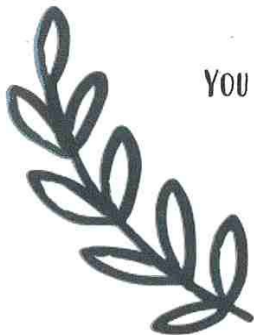

Sylvia Joyce (Sutherland) Campbell

July 24, 1939 ~ March 22, 2021 (age 81)

It is with our deepest sorrow, that we announce the passing of our beloved Mother, Ms. Sylvia Joyce Sutherland Campbell, of Lovelock, Nevada. Sylvia passed away peacefully on Monday, March 22, 2021. Sylvia was a former resident of Eureka, Utah where she was raised. She was Valedictorian of her high school graduating class. After graduating from Tintic High School, Eureka, Utah she attended the University of Utah until her marriage to John B. Campbell in 1959. After a brief time living in Salt Lake City, Sylvia moved back to Eureka to raise her family. Sylvia was one of the first of many who helped organize the committee that created the Tintic Historical Society of Eureka. Donating many old antiques from her grandmother's house which are now displayed in the Depot Museum. Sylvia was a member of the Tintic Ladies of Elks, and a member of the Eureka United Methodist Church. Sylvia moved to Reno, Nevada where she returned to college at the age of 50, attending University Nevada Reno, and received her Bachelor's Degree in Elementary Education. She taught Special Education, English as a second language, and tutored adults studying for their GEDs in Lovelock, NV, for the Pershing County School District for 15 years. Sylvia retired in 2007. Sylvia was an

avid reader, and sat on the library board in Lovelock, Nevada. She loved gardening in her yard, and doing crossword puzzles. She enjoyed attending luncheons at the local Senior Citizen Center after she retired, where she got her daily dose of socializing.

Sylvia is survived by her son, Shawn Campbell, (Michelle Joiner Olivas) of Lovelock, Nevada, and her two daughters, Nicole (Stanley) Green of Winnemucca, NV, and Traci (Kevin) Schow of Layton, Utah. Her sister, Ann (James) Anderson of Scottsdale Arizona, 3 brothers, John (Brenda) Sutherland Eureka, Utah, Craig (Betty) Sutherland of Peach Spring, Arizona, and Kerry Sutherland (Cathy Gardelli) of Denver, Colorado. She has 8 grandchildren, and several great-grandchildren. She was preceded in death, by her son, Anthony (Tony) Campbell, her husband, John Campbell, and her parents, Walt and Ila Sutherland.

Viewing will be on Saturday, March 27, 2021 at Brown Family Mortuary, 66 S. 300 E. Santaquin, Utah from 10 pm – 12 pm. Burial will take place at the Eureka City Cemetery at 1:00 pm following viewing.
