

At the January 8, 2024 Council Meeting, the City Council passed the following Ordinance for the public health, safety and welfare of the City. ORDINANCE NO. 2024-01-08-01

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING PARKING RESTRICTIONS ALONG MAIN STREET / HIGHWAY 6, PROVIDING A SAVINGS CLAUSE AND EFFECTIVE DATE FOR THE ORDINANCE.

PREAMBLE:

WHEREAS U.S. Highway 6 runs partly through the city limits of Eureka City and is known also as Main Street within Eureka; and

WHEREAS overnight parking along Main Street overnight creates issues for the public health, safety, and welfare of the City, and therefore, the Eureka City Council finds that the adoption of this Ordinance would promote the public health, safety and welfare of the City.

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the City Council of Eureka, Utah, that:

SECTION I.

It shall be unlawful for any person who owns or has possession, custody, or control of any motor vehicle to park or knowingly allow to be parked any vehicle on or along U.S. Highway 6, also known as Main Street, within Eureka city limits overnight.

SECTION II. PENALTIES

Violators may be ticketed and/or towed or booted by the City. If said vehicles are towed, they shall be impounded until the owner has paid the reasonable costs of towing/booting and storage.

Violation of any provision of this chapter may be prosecuted as a Class C Misdemeanor.

SECTION III. SEVERABILITY

If any provision or clause of this chapter or its application thereof to any person or circumstance is held to be unconstitutional or othelwise invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity shall not affect other sections, provisions, clauses, or applications which can be implemented without the invalid provision, clause, or application. To this end, the provisions of this chapter are declared to be severable.

SECTION IV. EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance shall become effective on the date passed by the City Council of Eureka.



Red Velvet Cheesecake Brownies

RECIPE CORNER

Ingredients

Red Velvet Brownies:

- 1 cup white sugar
- ½ cup unsalted butter, melted
- 1/4 cup unsweetened cocoa powder
- 1 ounce red food coloring
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 teaspoon distilled white vinegar
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 2 large eggs, slightly beaten
- 3/4 cup all-purpose flour

Cheesecake Filling:

- 1 (8 ounce) package cream cheese at room temperature
- 1/4 cup white sugar
- 1 large egg
- ½ teaspoon vanilla extract

Prep Time: 20 mins Cook Time: 30 mins Additional Time: 30 mins Total Time: 1 hr 20 mins

Directions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Grease an 8x8-inch baking pan.
- 2. For the red velvet brownies: Whisk 1 cup sugar and melted butter in a large mixing bowl; stir in cocoa, red food coloring, 1 teaspoon vanilla extract, vinegar, and salt, one at a time, mixing well after each addition to avoid lumps. Mix in 2 eggs until thoroughly combined.
- 3. Stir flour into cocoa mixture just until combined; set aside 1/4 cup batter. Pour remaining batter into the prepared baking dish.
- 4. For the cheesecake filling: Beat cream cheese in a bowl using an electric mixer on medium speed until light and fluffy. Add 1/4 cup sugar, 1 egg, and 1/4 teaspoon vanilla extract; continue to beat until well blended and only small lumps remain, 3 to 4 minutes.
- 5. Spoon cream cheese mixture in dollops over the batter in pan; gently smooth tops of dollops even with batter using a knife or offset spatula. Do not overmix. Drizzle reserved 1/4 cup of batter over the dollops of cream cheese mixture. Drag a knife or skewer through the batter and cream cheese mixture to create swirls.
- 6. Bake in the preheated oven until top is dry and edges have started to pull away from the sides of the pan, about 30 to 35 minutes. Cool completely before cutting into bars; store covered in refrigerator.


- **5.** This mine has an elevation of 6,470 feet and had main operations of Silver and Lead
