Last month I reminded citizens of the need to park off the streets during the winter months. Thank you for your cooperation, the plows have been able to get through most streets.

It seems that we tend to forget, not only how to drive in the snow, but some other basic snow rules. The invention of snow blades for our 4 wheelers and snow blowers have been a great help for all of us as we clean snow from our driveways and walkways, but let's remember common courtesy and obey another state law. It is illegal under state statue to put any of your snow back on the streets. Just take an extra minute or two as you finish cleaning your drives and walkways. Ask yourself, is the road in front of my house as clear as it was before I started? Are there windrows of snow left where I pushed snow across the street? Is the driving lane in the street as wide as it was before I started? It only takes a minute to make a couple of passes up and down your part of the street to push the snow out of the driving lane. As you have all been taught by your parents, "LEAVE THE PLACE BETTER THAN YOU FOUND IT." Your neighbors will thank you.
