EUREKA CITY SOLID WASTE FACILITY

The Solid Waste Facility or "City Dump" area is scheduled to be open every Saturday from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm for the citizens of Eureka that pay for garbage pickup. There are usually two dumpsters available for citizens to take their bulky waste and a place to take yard waste that does not fit in their regular tote. Items that are not accepted are dead animals, hazardous and chemical wastes, rocks or cement, tires, asphalt shingles or construction waste of any kind. Those doing construction on their property must get their own dumpster for all the waste.

There are occasions where the dump may have to close early if the dumpsters get too full. If for any reason the gate should be closed during the regular hours on a Saturday, please do not dump the debris in front of the gate or anywhere outside the dump area as that is against the law, and violators will be prosecuted. Instead, please contact the Mayor, Chris Dever, at 801-380-7700. You may also contact the City Office, Monday through Friday during regular office hours.

OPENINGS ON THE PLANNING COMMISSION

Eureka City is now accepting applications for one seat on the Planning Commission and two Alternate Members.

Powers and Duties. The planning commission shall have such powers as may be necessary to enable it to perform its functions and promote municipal planning within the city. It shall:

- * Prepare and recommend a general plan and amendments to the general plan to the city council as provided under the provisions of Section 10-9a-302 et seq., UCA.
- * Prepare and recommend the adoption of zoning ordinances and a zoning map and any amendment to said zoning ordinances and map to the city council, as provided under the provisions of Section 10-9a-302 et seq., UCA.
- * Administer provisions of the zoning ordinance, where specifically provided for in the zoning ordinance adopted by the city council.

- * Prepare and recommend adoption of subdivision regulations and amendments to those regulations to the city council, as provided under the provisions of Section 10-9a-602 et seq., UCA.
- * Recommend approval or denial of subdivision applications as provided under the provisions of Section 10-9a-604 et seq., UCA, in accordance with the rules and procedures set forth under the terms of the subdivision ordinance.
- * Prepare and recommend adoption of regulations by the city governing the approval, construction and maintenance of condominium projects, or amendments to such regulations (UCA 57-8-35).
- * Advise the city council on such matters as the city council directs.
- * Hear and decide any matters designated to it by the city council under the terms of the city's zoning ordinance or other development regulation, including the approval or denial of, or recommendations to approve or deny, development site plans and conditional use permits and other permits as designated by the Council.
- * Exercise any other powers: (a) that are necessary to enable it to perform its function; or (b) delegated to it by the city council.

All Applicants are required to submit a Resume along with their application. Applications will be accepted at the City Office, 15 North Church Street, Eureka, Utah.

OPENINGS ON THE BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT

Eureka City is seeking volunteers from our community to sit on an Appeal Authority Board or Board of Adjustment. We have three positions currently open and are in need of an alternate as well.

Definition of an Appeal Authority is: A person, board, authority, commission, agency or other body designated by ordinance to decide an appeal of a decision of a land use application or variance.

An Appeal Authority is empowered to hear and decide:

- 1. Appeals from zoning decisions applying the land use ordinance.
- 2. Variances from the provisions of the land use ordinance.

Anyone interested, may contact the City Office at 15 North Church Street, Eureka, Utah 84628 to apply, or if you have further questions concerning the duties of the board. Due to the increase of registered voters in Juab County, the State of Utah has done some Re-Districting in the following precincts which were required to be split:

Eureka 5, Nephi 3.5, and Mona 5

If you are registered to vote in Mona, Eureka 5 or Nephi 3.5 please refer to the Juab County Website at juabcounty.gov to reference the new maps.

This information is for review only, no further action is required.

The Lieutenant Governor's Office has moved all required voters to their appropriate districts. No further changes will be made.

The 2022 Primary and General Election in Juab County will be all <u>mail in</u>, if a primary election is required you will receive your ballot through the United Postal Service on or before June 14, 2022, for the General Election you will receive your ballot on or before October 17, 2022, you may send your ballot back to the Clerk/Auditor's Office through the postal service or you may also drop your ballot in the drop box located on the east side of the Juab County Building or you may bring your ballot to the Juab County Clerk/Audior's Office anytime between 7:00 am and 6:00 pm Monday thru Thursday.

Irish Soda Bread



INGREDIENTS

Canola oil, for pan

2 1/2 c. buttermilk, plus more for brushing

1 large egg

1 1/2 c. dried currants

3 c. all-purpose flour, spooned and leveled

1 c. whole wheat flour, spooned and leveled

1/4 c. wheat germ

3 tbsp. sugar

2 tsp. baking soda

2 tsp. kosher salt

6 tbsp. cold unsalted butter, cut into pieces, plus more for serving

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Preheat oven to 400°F. Lightly oil a 9-inch cast-iron skillet or cake pan. Whisk together buttermilk and egg in a bowl. Add currants and stir to combine.
- 2. Whisk together all-purpose flour, whole wheat flour, wheat germ, sugar, baking soda, and salt in a second bowl. Using your finger-tips, rub butter into flour mixture until small pebbles form. Create a well in center of flour mixture. Add buttermilk mixture, stirring with a wooden spoon in one direction and gradually incorporating, until combined (dough will be sticky).
- 3. Using slightly wet hands, shape dough into a ball; transfer to prepared pan. Let rest 10 minutes. Brush with buttermilk. Cut a large "X" about 1 inch deep in top of loaf, wiping blade with a damp cloth between cuts. Bake until golden brown and internal temperature registers 195°F to 200°F on an instant read thermometer, 50 to 60 minutes. Transfer to a wire rack; cool completely. Serve with butter.







Necessary Documentation

- · Government issued picture ID.
- Social Security cards for you and EVERYONE living in your household.
- A copy of your power, heat and water bills.
- Proof of ALL income received by all household members in the month prior to the month of your application.
- Proof of any eligible medical expenses, child support and alimony you paid in the month prior to the month of your application.
- · Proof of disability, if applicable.
- Proof of birthdate for a child age six (6) or under.
- · Additional documentation, if required.
