- *LIMBS AND YARDWASTE MUST BE PLACED IN DESIGNATED AREA.* No milled wood allowed in limb pile.
- There will also be a dumpster for **METAL ONLY!** This helps pay for the cost of cleanup, so ***PLEASE DO NOT REMOVE ITEMS!!***
- **USED OIL** will be accepted during specified Clean-Up Hours.
- **TIRES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED THIS YEAR!!**

NATURAL GAS

To the good citizens of Eureka,

This note is to help raise awareness and to provide information for those who choose to have their homes converted to natural gas.

The process to convert your home to natural gas may not be an easy process, there will be steps involved to switch over the new fuel type for your home or business.

Propane gas operates at a higher pressure than natural gas. With that in mind; your gas appliances will need to be “converted” if possible (if parts are available) or replaced, to function correctly with the lower fuel pressure.

Propane appliances WILL NOT function safely without a conversion of critical components for natural gas.

Because the lower fuel pressure of natural gas, your existing gas lines that are currently in your home may not have the capacity to safely supply the appliances with the correct fuel volume. Your existing lines need to be sized by a competent (certified or licensed) individual or company.

Unlike water lines (high pressure); fuel gas lines (low pressure) have to be sized correctly for the appliance to function correctly and safely.

Natural gas fuel lines must be iron pipe or corrugated stainless steel lines (CSST). Copper fuel lines in your home are ok for propane but not natural gas.

A permit from the City and subsequent inspection after the work is completed will be necessary before the natural gas will be hooked up.

The inspection will include a fuel line pressure test. (Which is provided by the contractor not the inspector) Inspection of gas lines and appliances (correct conversions need to be completed) A survey of the venting and combustion air will also be a part of the inspection.

It is not the City’s obligation to locate and refer contractors to property owners.

For your safety please find a licensed plumbing and or heating contractor to prepare your home or business for the conversion. Your health and safety is our top priority.

WATER CONSERVATION

On March 17, 2021, Governor Spencer J. Cox issued an Executive Order declaring a state of emergency due to drought conditions.

This is just a reminder that with Summer coming up, the need for outdoor watering increases, but, due to drought conditions we should all be mindful of our water use.

Eureka City already has a Time-of-Day Watering Resolution, Adopted July 9, 2002 to promote efficient sprinkler irrigation practices for all lawns and landscapes.

Watering during the hours of 7pm and 9am significantly increases irrigation efficiency.

Conservation of water through more efficient use is in the public interest and enhances the community’s economic, environmental, recreational resources.

The Time-of-Day Watering Parameters are:

- * Sprinkler irrigation of all lawns and landscapes is ***prohibited*** between the hours of 9am and 7pm.
- * North Side of Town:
(Monday, Wednesday & Friday)
- * South Side of Town:
(Tuesday, Thursday & Saturday)
- * No Watering on Sunday Permitted.

NOTICE OF MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS

Eureka City will hold a general election on Tuesday, November 2, 2021, to allow qualified voters of the community to elect a Mayor and (3) Three Council Members to serve on the Eureka City Council all for a Four (4) Year Term each and (1) One Council Member to serve on the Eureka City Council for a Two (2) Year Term.

Eureka City by ordinance, provides for a non-partisan election with a primary election if needed on August 10, 2021. Interested persons wanting to declare their candidacy and get their names on the ballot must file a Declaration of Candidacy in person with the Eureka City Recorder, during the open filing period of *Tuesday, June 1, 2021 through Monday, June 7, 2021 from 8:30 am to 5:00 pm*, 15 North Church Street, Eureka, Utah.

Per State Law, the 2021 Election will be Vote By Mail. Write-ins are not allowed for a primary election if one is required.

The qualifications for a candidate are: (1) Be a United States Citizen; (2) Be at least 18 years old; (3) Be a resident of Eureka City for 12 consecutive months immediately preceding the date of election; (4) Be a registered voter of Eureka City.

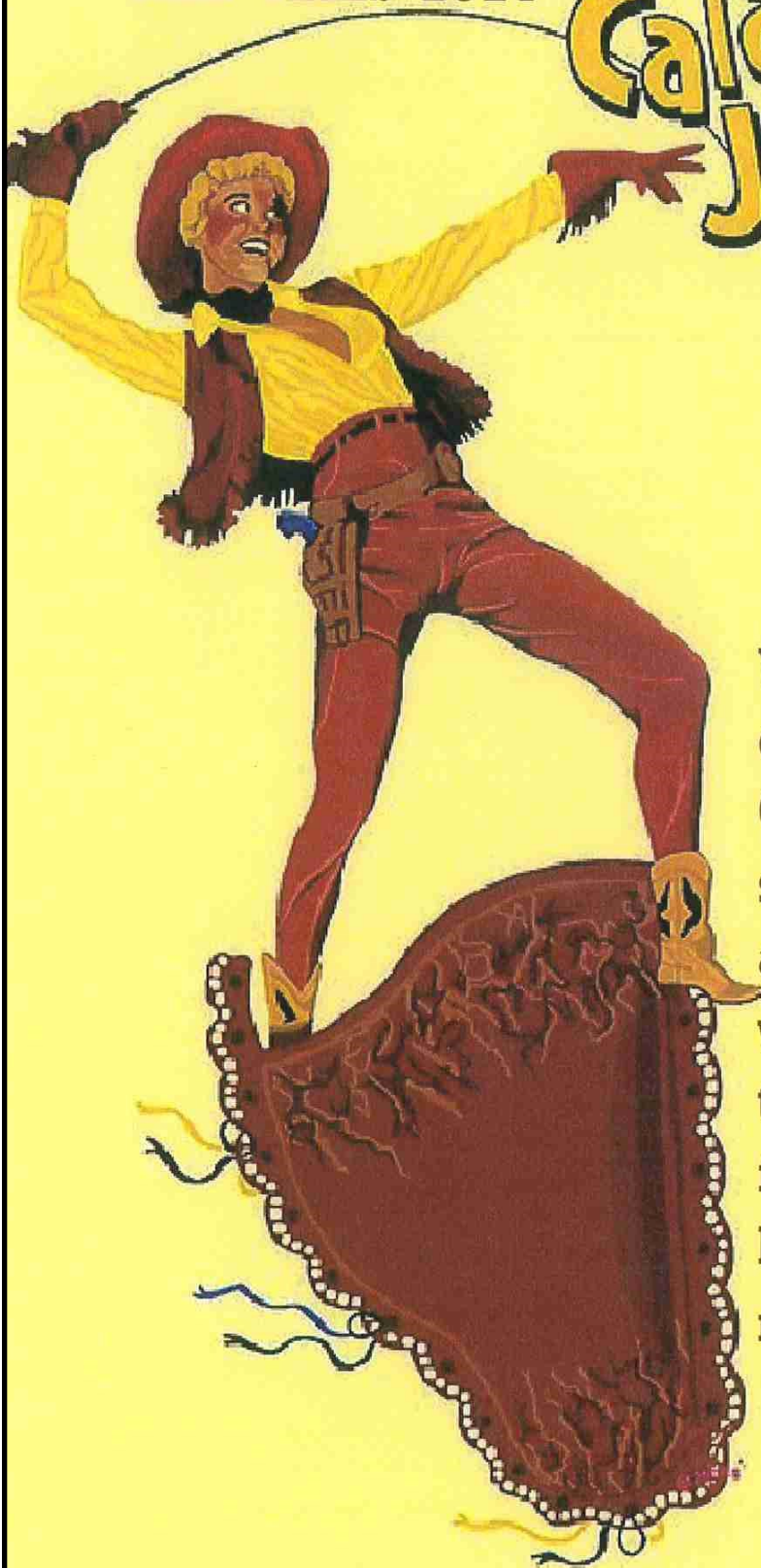

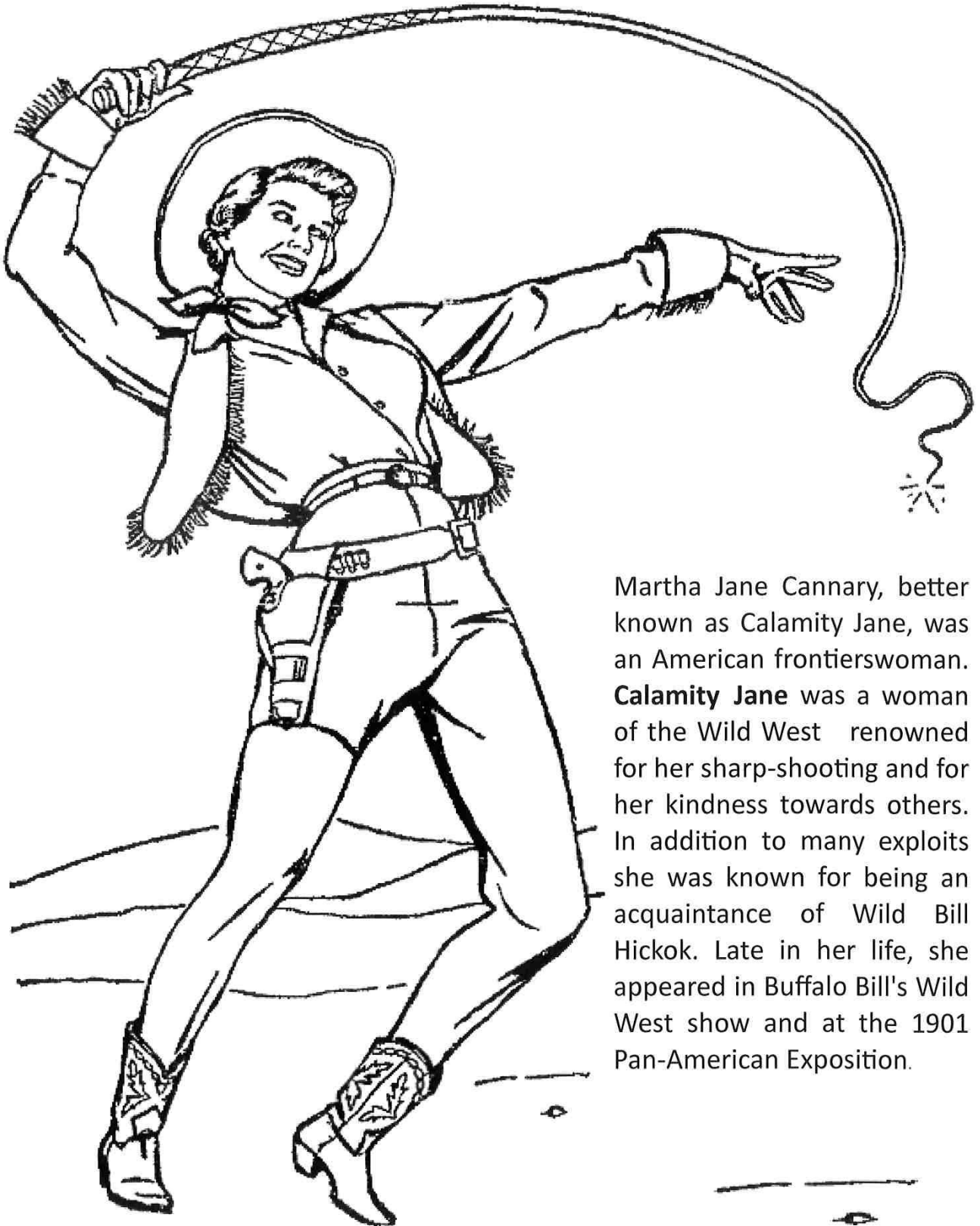

1953 - May 18, 2020

Lee Badertscher was born in Salt Lake City to Ray and Virginia Badertscher in 1953. He spent his early years in Eureka attending Tintic schools from kindergarten through High School. Following high school he attended the University of Utah and graduated from Utah State in 1978. Lee went to work at US Steel's Somerset Coal Mine in Colorado as a Mining Engineer.

He married Jeannie Baker and they lived several years of the Rocky Mountain High Life before relocating to Southern California in 1986. They raised two children there while Lee continued working as a consulting Engineer until his death.

Lee passed away unexpectedly after a short illness on May 18, 2020 and is survived by his wife, Jeannie, his two brothers John, Fred and his wife Cori, two children Erik Badertscher and Nicole Kvidera, her husband Jared and two granddaughters Madelyn and Penelope. Additional survivors include nephews, their wives and children.

Due to travel and gathering restrictions from the COVID Pandemic, services were delayed. A graveside service is planned at the Eureka Cemetery for 11:00 am on the one year anniversary of his death, this coming May 18th. Additionally family and friends are holding a Celebration of Life Barbecue in Payson afterwards. Directions will be available following the graveside service.
