NOTICE OF MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS

Eureka City (Town) will hold a general election on Tuesday, November 2, 2021, to allow qualified voters of the community to elect a Mayor and (3) Three Council Members to serve on the Eureka City Council for a Four (4) Year Term each and (1) One Council Member to serve on the Eureka City Council for a Two (2) Year Term.

Per State Law, the 2021 Election will be Vote By Mail. A sample ballot has been included in this notice listing all candidates.

Registered voters should start receiving ballots in the mail during the week of October 12th.

Due to recent changes in the postal service, there may be a slight delay in receiving/sending your ballots, so please take this into consideration when sending your ballot back. Please follow the instructions that come with your ballot and be sure to affix the proper postage.

Ballots may also be dropped off at the City Office until 5:00 pm on Election Day.



Ivanhoe Electric (formerly known as High Power Exploration or HPX) has been conducting geologic studies out of Eureka and Mammoth for over 3 years, and has recently begun drilling underground targets. Processing of rock samples requires additional people: **Work Opportunity!**

Core Technician:

This role is an integral member of a mineral exploration team, working under the direction of project geologist(s) and answering directly to the Project Manager. Individual responsibilities/expectations can change due to project needs/requirements.

Responsibilities include marking and cutting rock drill core, sampling core for assays, preparing paperwork for assay labs, measuring various characteristics of the rock, conducting data entry into computer (Excel and other programs), photography of samples, moving samples for longer term storage, and other tasks as needed.

Requirements: ability to lift and carry 50-75+ pounds short distance, current drivers license, ability to follow directions, repetitive tasks over long time periods, tolerance of hot/cold environments.

Training will be provided for tasks and safety protocols.

Ability to work with your hands, other technical skills (electrical, plumbing, carpentry, mechanical), familiarity with mining, core saws, GPS, use of database programs are plusses.

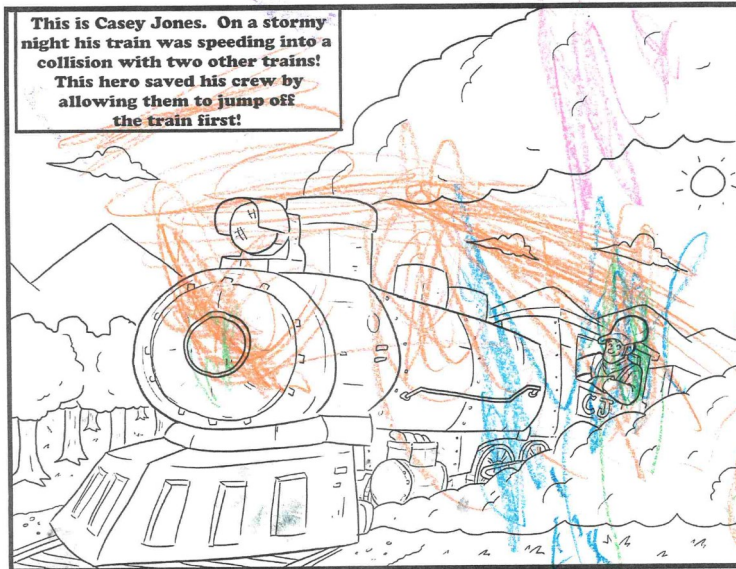

HEAT Program

Necessary Documentation

- Government issued picture ID.
- Social Security cards for you and EVERYONE living in your household.
- A copy of your power, heat and water bills.
- Proof of ALL income received by all household members in the month prior to the month of your application.
- Proof of any eligible medical expenses, child support and alimony you paid in the month prior to the month of your application.
- Proof of disability, if applicable.
- Proof of birthdate for a child age six (6) or under.
- Additional documentation, if required.
