Due to the COVID-19 restrictions, seating will be limited at that location, but will be available to all interested persons via the Zoom Meeting App. All interested persons will be given reasonable opportunity to be heard. Anyone wishing to comment must submit that comment in writing prior to June 25, 2020. All comments received will be read in the open meeting.
