She was born on March 7, 1947, to Sterlin Rae Laird and Georgia Alaine Thomas Laird. She had 6 brothers and 2 sisters. She grew up in Eureka. She and the neighborhood kids would get together at night and play games behind the Post Office. They would play Kick the Can, Run Sheep Run and many more. When they heard the curfew, they would go home. She had lots of fun attending schools Eureka Utah, Riverton High School (WY), Tintic High School, Utah Technical College (later called Utah Valley University).

She married Robert Timothy Grill on July 21, 1962. They had 4 children: Shirley, Jane, Robert and Sterlin. They have 10 Grandchildren and 4 Great Grandchildren. They lived in Salt Lake City, Eureka, Tintic Junction, Delta, then went back to Tintic Junction.

They loved to go to Lake Powell every year boating and fishing. They spent a lot of time in Moab rock climbing. They loved being together with their family.

Sherlin was a "part chaser" for over 55 years for their business. She worked as a seamstress at Fritzi's in Spanish Fork, she was a partner with Judy Smith running The New Look Upholstery at Tintic Junction, later she became partners with Ann Garbett and P.J. Dimick at the Wee Bee Quilt Makers in Eureka.

She was an aide at the Eureka Elementary working with Joan Morris in Title 1. She also was President of the Lady Elks 3 times, President of the Miners Union Auxiliary. She was a bowler at Duke's Lanes in Spanish Fork, Utah for 25 years and League Secretary and Treasurer for 15 years. She was Captain of DUP (Daughter's of the Utah Pioneers) 6 years and has been doing Humanitarian for 25 years Monday Mornings with sisters and friends making quilts and so much more.

Robert and Sherlin were sealed in the Salt Lake Temple on March 18, 2006. She has served in the Payson Temple since 2015 when the Temple was dedicated.

But most of all, she loved when she was the Relief Society President, getting to know the sisters, the families in the ward, and helping others serving under Bishop Ron Barlow and Bishop Marc Rowley.

They enjoyed selling Christmas trees in Arizona and then traded Arizona winters for Fish Lake summers. Jerald fished for mackinaw and Carol and the ladies would organize potlucks, shop, and do crafts.

In their later years, Jerald and Carol stayed closer to home. Carol had a woodworking shop in the back yard and enjoyed making fun wooden toys and gifts for her Kids and Grandkids. Her daughter and son-in-law moved to Eureka and were followed by their daughter and family. Now, Carol is proud to have four generations in Eureka. Carol is a grandmother of nine and a great grand or (GG) of seven.















